SCCCE President Chacanaca asked the Trustees to direct the Administration to provide a 2014-15 settlement of a 3% ongoing salary schedule increase for classified employees. The district has had a minimum of a 9% reserve each year since 2006-07, and the support staff need a "living wage".

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Santa Cruz Education Foundation Representative Cynthia Hawthorne updated the Trustees on news from the organization. The funds received through the AVID fundraiser will be spent to pay for student college visits. In addition, an individual has made a \$10,000 donation to SCEF, and part of this donation will be used to fund a November 18 trip for Harbor High School AVID seniors to visit UC Davis. This private donor has indicated a

willingness to continue to donate each year as long as the collaborative partnership between SCCS/SCEF continues and the Board of Education continues to fully fund AVID. SCEF hosted a successful Parent Leader Meet-and-Greet (PTA, ELAC, Site Council, etc.). Topics of discussion included shared goals, challenges, economy of scale purchasing power and effective communication with each other, as well as with district administration and Board Members. SCEF is partnering with the KidPower Personal Safety Organization to provide safety training at all of our elementary schools and programs – Ms. Hawthorne acknowledged Casey Coonerty-Protti for championing this effort. Community supporter Dr. Jim Logsdon reported he was very happy to receive the District "State of Our Schools" report in the mail this week. The District does not always get credit for its varied and extensive service on behalf of students in the local news.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent's Report

The Superintendent attended an annual community meeting (25 Shasta County school districts) for the Reach Higher Shasta initiative on October 27. The Shasta *Cradle to Career* program is similar to the *Santa Cruz County College Commitment* and they are currently working on a GATES Foundation planning grant. Superintendent Munro will share details of this visit with S4C and use this information to inform our efforts for the college and career readiness of Santa Cruz County students. The Superintendent met with Live Oak Superintendent Taylor to discuss collaboration and articulation efforts on behalf of students. The Harbor High School Baseball Field Grand Opening was October 24. Local Control AP surveys will be coming soon for staff, students and parents. We are seeking feedback on the current programs funded by the plan and continue to solicit input on needs. On October 17, Ms. Meeker and Superintendent Munro were able to attend the Cabrillo 4th Grade Open House. The Cabrillo staff and students created a welcoming experience for students and families. The Santa Cruz Education Foundation fundraiser for the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program raised more than \$10,000. We are grateful for their ongoing support.

BOARD MEMBERS' REPORTS

Board Members' Reports

Board Member Tracy-Proulx acknowledged the passing of Trustee Michael Pisenti, who served 11 years on the Board of Education for the Live Oak School District. Ms. Tracy-Proulx also extended her thanks to the Santa Cruz Education Foundation for their unwavering support of Santa Cruz City Schools students. Everyone is invited to the Gault Elementary Halloween/Dia de los Muertos Parade and Carnival on Saturday, October 31. The parade gathering begins at 9:00 a.m. and the carnival runs from 10:00 a.m. — 2:00 p.m.

Board Member Perez-Granados attended the Harbor High School Football Game/Homecoming Event and was very impressed by the community spirit exhibited by students, faculty and families – it was a great time. Dr. Perez-Granados visited Westlake Elementary with Dr. Thompson and Superintendent Munro and was pleased by the amount of parent involvement at the site. There were parents in many classrooms working with students. The teachers were extremely welcoming and the students were engaged.

Board Member Shonick thanked SCCCE President Chacanaca for inviting him to attend a Classified Employee Conference in San Jose. It was very informative to hear the needs of classified workers expressed on a statewide level and provided a new perspective for Trustee Shonick. It was a day well spent.

Board Member Threet has continued to be busy working on behalf of a couple of tax parcel measures that are currently on the ballot. This past Sunday Trustee Threet worked at Santa Cruz High School on the Beautification Committee – this work takes place on the 4th Sunday of each month. For interested community

members, the Santa Cruz High School Beautification Committee will meet on the Sunday following Thanksgiving, and the date for work in December has been moved to the 12th. All are invited.

Board Member Thompson attended the second in a series of five CSBA workshops for Masters in Governance. There was a considerable amount of preparatory homework before the class meeting, and the class was excellent. Dr. Thompson attended the SCEF AVID Fundraiser at the Oswald Restaurant. It was very inspiring and Dr. Thompson thanked the Santa Cruz Education Foundation (SCEF) for their collaboration on behalf of students. Dr. Thompson attended the Harbor High School Theater production "You Can't Take it With You" and acknowledged Teacher Cathy Warner and the amazing guidance she provides which empowers students. Dr. Thompson was present for the closing session of the 1st Queer and Allied Student Summit held at Santa Cruz High School. This was a countywide event that included information sessions and resource information

Board Member Coonerty attended the Santa Cruz Education Foundation AVID Fundraiser at Oswald's Restaurant and especially enjoyed the passion exhibited for the AVID program. Dr. Coonerty worked the phone bank for parcel tax measures O & P and had a great experience. Dr. Coonerty attended the Westlake Elementary Community Meeting on October 15. It was well attended and parents and teachers asked meaningful questions.

Board President's Report

Board President Vestal reported that Delta Charter School is busy preparing for their WASC visit next month. The staff feels supported by their current math intern and four student teachers. Current enrollment at Delta is 134. Delta Principal Mary Gaukel Forster is retiring and Board President Vestal attended a meeting to make plans to hire a new principal for Delta. The Cabrillo Open House for Grade 4 students and their families was a success, with more than 300 families attending. Board President Vestal congratulated the District for all the recent positive press – it is very nice to see.

8.3.1 Staff Report: Regional Occupational Program (ROP) and Career/Technical Education (CTE)

Superintendent Munro, along with SCCS Teachers Matthew Bruner, Barry Kirschen, Marco Lucadano, Leif Rovick and Larkin Wilson, reported to the Trustees. Information included: Career Technical Education/Transitioning ROP to SCCS; CTE/ROP offerings; benefits of CTE/ROP; individual teacher classroom experiences were recounted. Following the presentation, board members asked questions and made comments, and members of the audience, including two current Soquel High School CTE/ROP students, provided additional personal information and observations. This report was informational in nature and the Trustees did not take any action regarding this matter.

8.3.2 <u>Staff Report: Students Achieving Independence and Life success (SAIL) Program</u>

Special Education Director Stacy O'Farrell, along with Program Specialist Staci LeCagnin, Behavioral Inclusion Specialist Tracy Thomas, Mental Health Specialist Amanda Nisewaner, School Psychologist Elisa Solano, and teachers Carmia Rios and Eli Gregory reported to the Trustees. Information included: the continuum of Special Education service options; the transition of this program as inherited from the COE in years 1, 2, and the current 3rd year; the three-tiered Rtl Model for Behavior & Social Emotional Support within a restrictive environment; the Level System (independent, supervised and restricted); honor vs. opportunity; the motivation system; behavior tracking data; sample student schedule. Following the presentation, board members asked questions and made comments. This report was informational in nature, and the Trustees did not take any action regarding this matter.

8.3.3 Staff Report: Preliminary CBEDS Report

Mr. Monreal reported to the Trustees regarding this matter. The California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS) is an annual data collection administered the first Wednesday in October. This year CBEDS day was October 7th. The purpose of CBEDS is to collect demographic information on students, faculty and district employees. The district as a whole has decreased enrollment from 2014-15 to 2015-16. We had a district-wide decrease of 134 students. The elementary district (grades Pre-K – 6) decreased enrollment by 51 students from last year, and the secondary district (grades 7-12) decreased by 83 students. Following the presentation, Board Members asked questions and made comments. This report was informational in nature, and no action was taken by the Trustees regarding this matter.

8.3.4 <u>New Business: Resolution 23-15-16 Designating Week of the Classified Employee and Week of the</u> Teacher

Ms. Parks reported that Santa Cruz City Schools would like to acknowledge the hard work of our staff in service to students by recognizing the week of April 25-29 as the Week of the Classified Employee and May 2-6 as the Week of the Teacher. Board Member Tracy-Proulx moved approval of Resolution 23-15-16 Designating the Week of the Classified Employee and the Week of the Teacher and Dr. Coonerty seconded this motion.
